 - Don't fret (or worry) [37:1a, 37:7b, 37:8b]
 - Don't envy [37:1b]
 - Don't be hot blooded [37:8a]
- Rather, be righteous
 - Trust in God [37:3a, 37:5b, 37:9b]
 - Do good [37:3a, 37:27]
 - Be faithful [37:3b, 37:5a]
 - Find delight in God [37:4a, 37:11, 37:34a]
 - Be patient [37:7a]

REGARDING THE WICKED

- Don't worry because of them [37:1, 37:7b]
- Don't envy them [37:1b]
- The fate of the wicked (and why we shouldn't worry about them or envy them)
 - They are temporary [37:2, 37:10, 37:20, 37:35-36]
 - God will defeat them [37:9, 37:13, 37:22b, 37:28b, 37:34b, 37:16-17, 37:38]
 - Their wicked schemes are ultimately self defeating [37:15]
- They hate the righteous [37:12, 37:14, 37:32]
- They are greedy for gain [37:21a]

REGARDING THE RIGHTEOUS

- The righteous should focus on the mission [37:3, 37:8b]
- God will vindicate the righteous [37:6]
- The righteous will be blessed on earth and in eternity [37:9b, 37:11a, 37:22a, 37:29, 37:34, 37:4, 37:18, 37:19, 37:25-26, 37:37]
- The righteous are upheld by God [37:16-17, 37:23-24, 37:30-31, 37:27-28a, 37:33, 37:39, 37:40]
- The righteous are generous [37:21b, 37:26]
